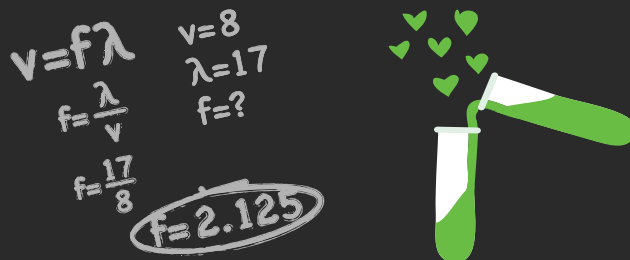


Introduction and Background

Procedure (the date):

Step 1: Dinner and a Memory
